

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



Greater Columbia BDPA is Host to the 2011 Southeast Regional High School Computer Competition (HSCC)

Columbia, SC—The 2011 BDPA Southeastern Regional High School Computer Competition (HSCC) was held on Saturday, June 18th, at **IT-oLogy**, a local sponsor of the event. Hosting the event was the Greater Columbia BDPA chapter. Competing teams from the Atlanta, Triangle (Raleigh) and Charlotte BDPA chapters came to Columbia to compete in the event which is the precursor to the larger HSCC held annually at the National BDPA Technology Conference and Career Fair.

BDPA is an internationally recognized organization of IT professionals whose goals include preparing young people who are interested in becoming the next generation of **Information Technology Thought Leaders** for the academic and professional arenas. Its motto is "From the Classroom to the Boardroom".

Each year BDPA chapters across the country offer website and database design classes to middle and high-school students. The duration of each chapter's program varies; however, the Greater Columbia chapter holds classes from March through July of each year. In addition to technical subjects, students are also exposed to soft skills training, current technology topics and speakers from various professions.

At the national level, BDPA hosts a computer competition at its annual conference and each chapter is invited to bring a five-member team to compete. This 2011 National BDPA Technology Conference will be held in Chicago, IL from August 3-6. Winners at the national level are rewarded with scholarships and sponsor-donated items. The first-place winners of the 2010 competition each got a laptop from HP in addition to their scholarship winnings!

For students who are not on competition teams, the BDPA National Technology Conference holds a Youth Technology Camp (YTC) where students attend seminars and hands-on workshops on technology, entrepreneurship and soft skills topics offered by leaders in their fields. The X-Box competition workshops are always a favorite.

Industry Update

The Project Management Professional (PMP)® credential examination will be revised this year, based on updates to the professional role of a PMP® credential holder recently found by PMI's Role Delineation Study (RDS).

PMI conducts a role delineation study for the PMP credential every five to seven years to ensure the credential reflects contemporary practice, evolves to meet current needs in the profession, and to comply with the PMP's credentials accreditation against the ISO 17024 standard.

Exam Changes

Project managers pursuing the credential or preparing for the exam in the upcoming year should be aware that approximately 30 percent of the PMP exam will change.

Specifically, the Professional and Social Responsibility content area (Domain 6) will now be tested in *every* domain rather than as a separate domain on the examination.

The new examination is scheduled to be released on August 31st, 2011.

This means that the last day to take the current PMP exam is August 30th, 2011.

Candidates who would like to take the current version of the examination are advised to schedule early, prior to our National BDPA Technology Conference if possible, to better ensure that they are able to obtain a test date before the update.


